A vaccine for African Swine Fever?

Dr David Williams is a virologist and leader of the Emergency Disease Laboratory Diagnosis group at the CSIRO Australian Centre for Disease Preparedness (ACDP; formerly the Australian Animal Health Laboratory), Geelong, Victoria. This group comprises multidisciplinary capability in virus diagnostics, contributing to national and regional emergency animal disease diagnostics and surveillance. Dr Williams' research interests have included the detection, diagnosis, and epidemiology of emerging and exotic viruses that affect humans and animals in Australia and overseas. A major focus of his work has been the laboratory diagnosis and pathogenesis of African Swine Fever (ASF) virus. Dr Williams is the OIE Expert at the OIE Reference Laboratory for African Swine Fever at ACDP. He regularly contributes to workshops and missions for the FAO and OIE on ASF diagnostics and preparedness.
